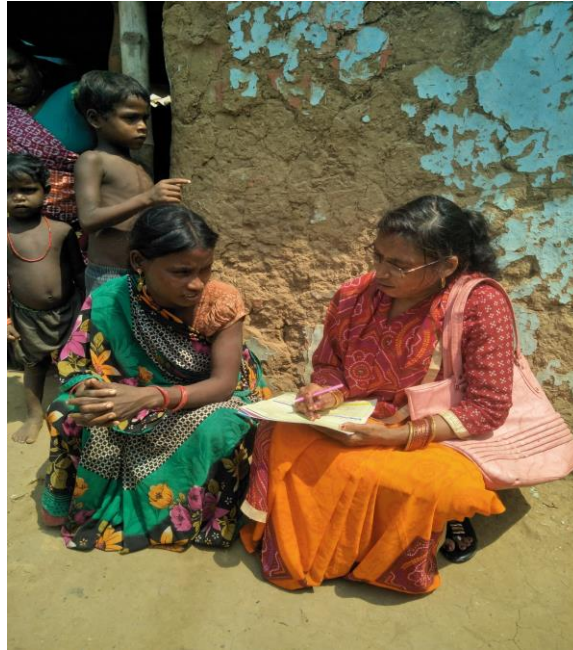

बड़वानी। शिविर में स्वास्थ्य परीक्षण करते चिकित्सक।

## स्वास्थ्य शिविर में गंभीर मरीजों को किया चिन्हित

बड़वानी, (आरएनएन)। पहल जन सहयोग विकास संस्था एवं महिन्द्रा फॉयनेंस कम्पनी के संयुक्त तत्वावधान में 22 दिसम्बर को निःशुल्क स्वास्थ्य शिविर का आयोजन किया गया। सेंधवा के कलालदा ग्राम में आयोजित इस शिविर में करीब 450 लोगों का स्वास्थ्य चिकित्सकों द्वारा जांचा गया। इस दौरान जनरल फिजिशियन, शिशु रोग विशेषज्ञ, दंत रोग विशेषज्ञ और स्त्री रोग विशेषज्ञों ने परीक्षण कर दवा भी वितरित की। साथ ही निःशुल्क परामर्श, हीमोग्लोबिन, रक्तचाप और ब्लड शुगर आदि की भी जांच की गई।

शिविर का उद्घाटन मुख्य अतिथि क्षेत्रीय प्रबंधक महिन्द्रा फॉयनेंस राजेश शर्मा ने किया। साथ ही उन्होंने कहा कि इस तरह के शिविरों का होते रहना चाहिए, इनमें लोगों को स्वास्थ्य से जुड़ी जानकारी भी मिलती है। वहीं कम्पनी के सीनियर प्रबंधक देवेन्द्र सिंह ने कहा कि लोगों को बेहतर स्वास्थ्य सुविधाएं मुहैया कराने के लिए ही उक्त आयोजन किया गया। शिविर में विशेषकर बच्चों व महिलाओं के स्वास्थ्य की जांच कर स्वास्थ्य सरक्षा सम्बंधित

### पहल ने आयोजित किया शिविर, मरीजों को उपचार के लिए किया रेफर

जानकारी दी गई। शिशुरोग विशेषज्ञ डॉ गोपाल अग्रवाल ने बच्चों में खून की कमी, विटामिन की कमी, एनीमिया, रतौंधी, दिल में छेद, कटे फटे होंठ, वाक व श्रवण बाधित बच्चों की पहचान की। साथी यह भी बताया कि जल्द से जल्द इनके ऑपरेशन की व्यवस्था की जाएगी, जिससे ये बच्चे पूर्णरूप से स्वस्थ हो सकें। वहीं इस दौरान पहल संस्था सचिव ने टीबी पर बने सांप-सीढ़ी खेल के माध्यम से आसपास के लोगों में टीबी के प्रति जागरूकता फैलाई। विजेता प्रतिभागियों को नितिन टंडन और विकास चौहान ने पुरस्कृत भी किया।

इस शिविर में हीमोग्लोबिन जांच की गई जिसमें 150 महिलाओं में से 11 महिलाओं और 80 पुरुषों में से 11 पुरुषों का हीमोग्लोबिन ठीक पाया गया। ज्यादातर महिलाओं का एचबी 6.7 ग्राम मिला। इस दौरान मरीजों के स्वास्थ्य कार्ड भी बनाए गए। गंभीर मरीजों को सीएचसी व जिला अस्पताल रेफर किया गया। शिविर में महिन्द्रा के सुगीत श्रीवास्तव, डॉ पटेल आरबीएसके की टीम एवं सेंधवा डॉक्टर एसोसिएशन का भी विशेष सहयोग रहा।
